The ceiling was painted by Francesco Martini and Carlo Zucchi, 1765-67. The theme of the painting is coined from the Roman mythology. Four medallions show the traditional mythological themes: «Venus with the Mirror» (partially lost), «Leda and the Swan», « Jupiter and Callisto», «Luna and Endymion». Two painted panels above the mirrors depict the themes after F. Boucher – «Luna and Endymion», «Satyr and Bacchante». The alcove woodcarvings were reconstructed in 1990 by A. Mežkazs. The original tiled stoves were made by G. Kater, a ceramist from Danzig, in 1740. Damask silk wall hangings were woven in Moscow after the pattern of original 18th century wall hangings in San-Souci Palace.

№ 127 – THE DUKE'S BATHROOM

The room was connected to the Duke's Bedroom; the door in the south wall was bricked up later. The walls were originally tiled with white Delft tiles, now they are covered with replica tiles. The ceiling decoration was executed by Johann Michael Graff's team between 1765 and 1768. The plank floor was made in 1740. The stove was heated from the fireplace in the Duke's Study. In 1934 it was dismantled and transferred to the Latvian Ethnographic Open Air Museum, but in 1991 reinstalled from old photographs.

№ 128 - THE DUKE'S DRESSING ROOM

The ceiling decoration was executed by Johann Michael Graff's team in the 1760s. Restoration was carried out in the 1980s.

Broché silk tapestries were made in Moscow. Wall panels were reconstructed after the pattern of panels in other rooms, but the panels in the apertures as well as the door to the balcony have been preserved form the 1730s. The plank floor was made in 1740. The secret door leads into the Duke's bedroom. The original stove was dismantled in 1938 and transferred to the Latvian Ethnographic Open Air Museum. It was reinstalled from an old photograph in 1990. The room was opened to the public on 24th May 2008.

Renovation of polychrome and silvering as well as reconstruction of wall panels was sponsored by Boris Teterev.

Rembrandt's painting was purchased by Duke Peter of Courland at a sale in Amsterdam in 1777. It was in the collection of Dutch paintings displayed at Rundāle. In 1795 the Duke's art collections were transported to Sagan Palace in Silesia. In 1847 the descendents of Duke Peter's daughter Pauline, Princess of Hohenzollern-Hechingen, moved part of the artworks to Löwenberg Palace, but around 1858 the painting was sold. In 1912 it was obtained by the Hamburger Kunsthalle which purchased it from a private collector.
